Impressive Research Award for SDA Student

Nicole Fitzgerald '22 has been selected for the third annual New York Institute of Technology Mini-Research Grant Award for her research proposal, "Antibiotic Producers in Our Soil," with her mentor, Cristina Manuel. Nicole's proposal states,



"Antibiotic resistance is a growing worldwide problem, as researchers are striving to find new anti-microbial agents. One common source is in soil, which contains microbes that fight other microbes. The aim of my science experiment was to collect and test soil samples from three major parks in Jersey City and identify potential antibiotic producers within the bacterial content." The Grant Review committee determined her submission to have scientific merit and potential impact in the STEM fields, including health. For her outstanding accomplishment, Nicole was recently featured as News-12's Viewer of the Day with news anchor Della Crews.

Students Experience NYC Art and Culture

Since SDA is located so close to Manhattan, our students are fortunate to visit New York City often to enrich their high school education. Here's a recent sampling:

Students in Ms. McKenzie's Spanish Heritage class visited Repertorio NYC to see the Spanish language play, *La Gringa*! Our ladies attended the weekday matinee, listened to a pre-performance lecture and participated in a post-performance Q&A. La Gringa is the comedic story of a young woman from New York who goes to Puerto Rico in search of her extended family and is confronted by complicated misperceptions about both herself and her family.

Drama Club and Glee Club members attended a performance of Beetlejuice! Based on Tim Burton's film, this musical tells the story of Lydia Deetz, a strange and unusual teenager whose whole life changes when she meets a recently deceased couple and a demon with a thing for stripes. The Drama Club studied the performance and acted out the song "Deyo," a number from the play, and performed it during class.

The Dominoes once again graced the stage of Radio City Music Hall on Monday, December 12, and sang a collection of Christmas songs preceding the Radio City Music Hall Christmas Spectacular.

Ms. Lewis' AP Art History and Studio classes were treated to a day at The Metropolitan Museum of Art in Manhattan to study a number of the museum's collections. The group spent time at the Fifth Avenue location studying art from the Classical World, Africa, Asia and South America. Once at the museum, the students were tasked with finding and examining several pieces of art, architecture and artifacts and determining how and why they were made and how they relate to each other, as well as other works within AP Art History. As part of the assignment, they answered questions such as: What do you see that helps you know what the object is made of and how it was formed? What do you see that is a clue to inform you when it was made? The trip was an opportunity for students to connect the art they discovered at The Met with the art they have been studying in class.


SDA's Theater Arts Program performs Hairspray

A Message from the Academic Dean

Dear Parents and Guardians,

At our most recent class assemblies, we handed out Honor Roll certificates to students who made it to the Academic Dean's List for the first semester of this school year. It is with great pride that I called on 89 students who earned First Honors (GPAs of 3.75 and above) and 31 students who earned Second Honors (GPAs of 3.50 to 3.74) These numbers account for more than half the student population of SDA, which has been quite the trend for a good number of years now.

I took the opportunity to highlight the above fact with our young ladies, referring to it as Saint Dominic Academy's USP, our unique selling proposition. That, given the way our classes are conducted, it should come as no surprise that our students are truly learning and, as a result, are bringing home good grades, and the recognition that goes with such.

I have come to realize that we are not your typical high school.
